***C-2 and C-3 Opioid Restrictions: Prescriptions from NON-Tulalip Health Clinic providers must follow the rules put forth by CMS for acute pain and will require an attestation form from the provider for chronic pain (defined as >42 tabs/90 days). Prescriptions from Tulalip Health Clinic providers will only be covered if used for acute pain, or chronic pain related to cancer, hospice, or if from one of the following specialists that the patient was referred to: pain, rheumatology, physiatrist, neurosurgery, or orthopedics (at which point the rules must then follow CMS as stated previously for NON-Tulalip Health Clinic providers).***
